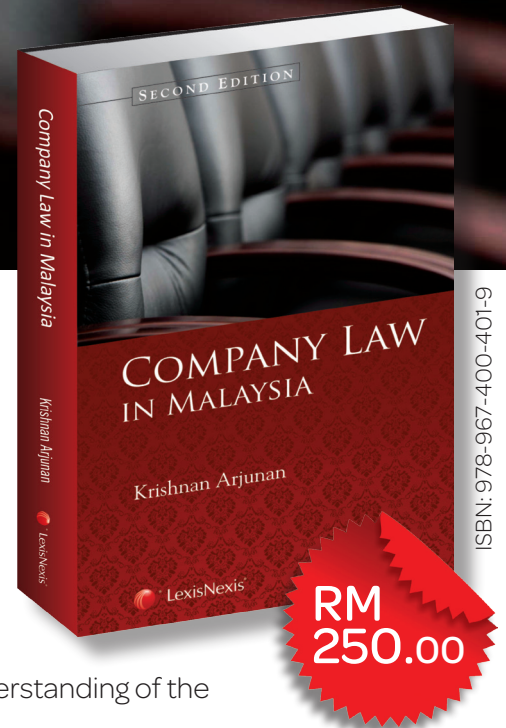
- Most of the cases referred provide details to facilitate a better understanding of the decisions and underlying legal principles.
